Auburn City Code section 15.08.040, Recyclable materials and solid waste storage, and WAC 51-40-009

Recyclable Materials and Solid Waste Storage

- 1. For the purpose of this section, the following definition shall apply: Recycled Materials means those solid wastes that are separated for recycling or reuse, such as papers, metals and glass.
2. All new buildings shall provide space in accordance with Table No. 5-F for the storage of recycled materials and solid waste; EXCEPTION: Group R, Division 3 and Group U Occupancies.
3. The storage area shall be designed to meet the needs of the use or occupancy, efficiency of pick-up, and shall be available to occupants and haulers.
4. Storage and Handling of Recyclables and Solid Waste shall also comply with the 1997 Edition of the Uniform Fire Code, Article 11, and Section 1103.
