



Each weekend young makers can explore a new hands-on project at the intersection of Art, Science, and Technology. Each month will have a different theme, but not each session is mandatory.



### January—Game Design

It's always been a human tradition to tell stories in the cold winter months—and game design is a powerful way to tell our stories. Students will use 3 different online tools to complete 3 individual digital games in total!

- **January 7—The Maze (#51279):** Students will learn about world-building and storytelling. As a group, we'll invent a new world, and each student will use that world to write their own game. We'll use Twine to create an interactive story where characters' decisions affect the game's ending.
- **January 14—Video Games (#51280):** We'll begin to explore what makes a video game and how to build one using Scratch.
- **January 21—Building Game Worlds (#51282):** Students will be guided through the concepts of what a video game includes and creating a game environment using Gamestar Mechanic.
- **January 28—Having Fun (#51284):** Today we will focus on what makes a game fun! Students will finish, play test, and improve playable video game in Gamestar Mechanic!

### February—Lego Robotics





## General Information

### Team Assignment Procedures

First priority is given to children who reside or attend a public or private school in the Auburn or Dieringer School District boundaries, including all Auburn street addresses. Participants must play in grade level in which they are currently enrolled (i.e. players are not allowed to play up or down a grade level). When registered by the published deadline players are assigned to teams by the following priorities:

1. Returning players are placed with the same head coach as the previous year, provided player attends the same school as the coach's child. Parents can request players not be retained by returning coach.
2. Non-returning players are assigned to teams based on the school they attend or would attend, e.g., home school, step program.
3. If there are enough registrations for more than one team from a school, teams are filled in the order registrations are received. The balance of players, if not enough for a full team, will be combined with another school.

If registered after the published deadline, players are assigned to a team by the parks staff. Assignments are based on the need for players on teams, not necessarily the school the student attends. Late fees may be assessed. Players from outside of the Auburn and Dieringer school district boundaries will be accepted after the deadline and assigned to teams as needed.

The City does not discriminate for any reason, to include discrimination on the basis of sex in the operation, conduct, or administration of its community athletic programs. Sports leagues that use City of Auburn public facilities are also forbidden from discriminating on the basis of sex in the operation, conduct, or administration of community athletic programs. Concerns or questions related to Sex Discrimination in community recreation program requirements should contact Brian Petty, Recreation Manager for the City of Auburn at [bpetty@auburnwa.gov](mailto:bpetty@auburnwa.gov).

### Coaches Needed

Volunteers are needed to make the youth sports programs a success. We are recruiting coaches and assistant coaches. Coaches are certified through the National Youth Sport Coaches Association (NYSCA). Contact us if you would like to assist with this year's program. Volunteer assignments are made on the basis of completing a City of Auburn volunteer application, signing and adhering to a coach's contract and a cleared Washington State Patrol background check.

### Certification

NYSCA believes children deserve a wholesome experience in youth sports, which can only occur when coaches and parents become aware of the important roles they play as volunteers. The coach certification program covers the areas of social/psychological aspects of coaching, conditioning, the coach as a role model, practice organization, teaching the basic fundamentals and techniques, and child abuse training. The fee is \$20 per coach (Auburn Parks, Arts & Recreation pays certification fees for the head coach).

### Other Opportunities

The City of Auburn Parks, Arts & Recreation Department has a variety of part-time and temporary positions available for spring and summer jobs. Opportunities include referees and scorekeepers. The minimum age for all positions is 16 years old.

### Team Sponsorships

The Auburn Parks, Arts & Recreation Department organizes over 1,600 boys and girls in the Auburn area into t-ball, cub baseball, baseball, fastpitch, volleyball and track and field. Boys and girls, in grades K-12 learn the basic fundamentals in a fun-filled environment. In order to keep registration fees affordable, and to provide team uniforms and equipment, sponsors are needed for teams. In return, the sponsor receives their business or organization name and logo on a T-shirt uniform, an 8x10 team photo plaque and the benefit of helping youth enjoy a positive recreation experience. The sponsorship fee is \$195 per team. Sponsor logo on shirts must be supplied in Adobe Illustrator (.ai) or other usable format. 



### Special Friends and Volunteers

Unified Sports is dedicated to improving understanding and breaking down the barriers between persons with and without disabilities.

### Individual Skills

The Individual Skills program teaches basic skills necessary to play a team sport. Every sport has basic skills that are building blocks for more complex movements and coordination. The program is designed for individuals with developmental disabilities of the same ages and abilities to still participate while learning the basic skills and concepts of the sport.





## REFUND POLICY

### Cancelled Program

If a program is cancelled by the Parks, Arts and Recreation Department, the registrant will receive a credit on account or full refund. Refunds will be issued by same form as initial payment (e.g. credit card to same credit card, cash or check will be a check refund).

### Prior to Start of Program

Refund requests made (3) business days prior to the start of a class, workshop or activity must be made to the department in writing, by phone, or in person, stating the reason for the request. Refund requests made less than 3 business days prior to the start of a class, workshop or activity are subject to a Division Manager approval or his/her designee.

For activities with a fee of more than \$5, a \$5 administrative fee is charged. For activities less than \$5, a credit is placed on the individual's account. There is no administrative fee for credits placed on account. Late fees are non-refundable. For programs requiring the purchase of a pre-paid ticket or admission fees, that portion of the fee is non-refundable unless the spot can be filled by another registrant.

### After Start of Program

Refund requests made after the activity has begun, due to illness, injury or unforeseen circumstance, must be made in writing and may be granted on a prorated basis. Requests must be approved by a Division Manager or his/her designee. No refunds/credits on account will be issued to an athletic team if that team cancels out of a league or tournament after schedules are drawn up.

If the registrant is not satisfied with a class, program, or activity which meets 4 or more times, he/she may, in writing, identify his/her concerns and request one of the following:

1. Repeat the program at no additional charge
2. Receive a credit that may be applied to another activity
3. Receive a refund with no administrative charge

The written request must be received before the third scheduled activity and must be approved by a Division Manager. This policy applies to all programs except trips and tours, outdoor programs, flex option classes and all adult and youth team sport leagues.
